1. To review Greek vocabulary, morphology, and intermediate syntax necessary to read the Greek New Testament.
2. To learn the essentials of the Greek verb system.
3. To further develop Greek interpretation skills.

C. ASSIGNMENTS

1. Assigned readings:
 - a. Baugh, *Tense-Form Choice* (entire)
 - b. Burton, *Syntax of Moods & Tenses*, pp. 1–45.
2. Work through the weekly assigned passage in the Greek New Testament in preparation for class each week. Here are the passages and assigned readings:

3. Prepare Greek Reading Notes in accordance with the “Greek Reading Notes Assignment” available on my web site (link below). Your Reading Notes *must* reflect some consideration of the question of Greek syntax we are studying in addition to the requirements found in the “Greek Reading Notes Assignment.” To be included with these notes, you will be asked to perform word studies on words or phrases specified in class.

3. There will be a final exam during finals week. This exam will be comprehensive including any material given in class by the instructor. You will be asked whether you have read the assigned readings on the final exam (5% of course grade).
