Master of Arts Biblical Studies

2-3 years • 72 credit hours

PURPOSE: As students prepare for both ecclesiastical and secular vocations, there is no better foundation than a thorough knowledge of God's Word.

PLAN: We believe the study of Scripture is founded upon an understanding of the biblical languages, Greek and Hebrew, equipping graduates with the tools to study the Bible in the language of its authors, thus enhancing their ability to properly exegete and apply the Word of God.

Master of Arts Theological Studies

2-3 years • 72 credit hours

PURPOSE: The ability to know what you believe and why you believe it is crucial to the life of faith. Students are given the knowledge and skills necessary to systematize and apply biblical truth to the intellectual issues confronting the church and the surrounding culture.

PLAN: Students learn to exegete individual passages of Scripture accurately and understand the system of truth revealed in the Scriptures, as well as the major issues in faith and life that the church has confronted throughout its history and in contemporary intellectual and cultural movements.

Master of Arts Historical Theology

2-3 years • 72 credit hours

PURPOSE: Students are equipped with a historically-minded approach to evaluate current events of today in relation to all that has come before. Students to give an honest and coherent account of the past as well as to relate significant issues of historical theology to contemporary intellectual and cultural movements.

PLAN: Enable students to gain an understanding of the historiography of theology, the historical development of the various Christian theological traditions and the critical skills for evaluating them.
